#### State Journal All-Decade Team

## Quarterback: Andy Schmitt, St. Johns (2005, Eastern Michigan) -

Named the State Journal all-area Dream Team quarterback by area coaches as a senior from a group that included Holt's Mikhail Eiseler, Everett's Mike Canfield and Haslett's Nathan Turner, Schmitt threw for nearly 1,922 yards and ran for almost 869 in leading St. Johns to a Division 3 runner-up finish as a senior.

## • Running back: Chris Robinson, Ovid-Elsie (2010, Grand Valley State) -

Ran for 7,123 yards (fourth-best in state history) and 98 touchdowns (second-best), with an arearecord 2,844 yards as a junior in helping the Marauders to a Division 5 state runner-up finish.

## Running back: Antoine Bagwell, East Lansing (2002, California-

Pennsylvania/Joliet Junior College) - Ran for more than 3,300 yards and nearly 50 touchdowns combined over his final two seasons, after which he was named LSJ defensive Player of the Year as a defensive back both seasons.

Running back: Onaje Miller, Sexton (2011,

### committed to Michigan State) -

In his second season on varsity last fall, Miller averaged 8.1 yards per carry for 1,758 overall and 26 touchdowns. He also had seven return touchdowns for a school-record 33 total - and could approach the school's single-season rushing record of 2,386 yards this fall.

Receiver: Michael Stevenson, Everett (2005):

Moved from quarterback after freshman year and over his final two seasons caught 89 passes for 1,831 yards and nine touchdowns - with 50 catches and 1,100 yards as a senior.

• Receiver: Jason Fleet, DeWitt (2008, Saginaw Valley State):

Despite a standout receiver opposite him in the Panthers' lineup, Fleet still had the most incredible season of any area receiver this decade playing Class B or A opponents with 66 catches for 1,302 yards and 19 touchdowns as a senior.

• Offensive lineman: Paul Jorgensen, DeWitt (2010, Northwestern):

An impassable pass blocker, Jorgensen became one of the area's most recruited players of the decade and actually was the LSJ defensive Player of the Year as a senior.

• Offensive lineman: Bridger Buche, Portland (2007, Eastern Michigan):

Moved from fullback at the start of high school to a pancaking lineman and was the LSJ overall Male Athlete of the Year as a senior. He also made the all-area Dream Team as a junior defensive lineman.

• Offensive lineman: Blake Botek, Grand Ledge (2004, Oklahoma State):

Coming from a school that yearly seems to produce a top area lineman, Botek was the best of the bunch. He didn't allow a sack his final three seasons and made the Class A all-state team as a senior.

## • Offensive lineman: Matt Armstrong, Sexton (2008, Grand Valley State):

From a program that has produced Division I and even an NFL lineman over the decade, Armstrong was the most feared in high school and the top blocker in front of Dunn. He also had 11 sacks as a defensive tackle as a senior.

## • Offensive lineman: Stephen Johnson, Holt (2006, Eastern Michigan):

His 6-foot-5 height gave him additional reach during a season in which the Rams seemed to run almost every play. He was the decade's best for a program that has become a statewide standard-setter for offensive line strategy and play.

### Kicker: Ronnie Budd, Charlotte (2004, Central Michigan):

His senior season included making 45 of 49 extra point tries plus four field goals, including one from 50 yards, on the way to making the Class B all-state team.

### Defensive lineman: Blake Treadwell, East Lansing (2009, Michigan State):

Named LSJ defensive Player of the Year as a senior defensive tackle after making the all-area Dream Team as a junior on the offensive line. He couldn't be blocked as a senior, when he seemed to shut down one side of the field.

# • Defensive lineman: D.J. Young, Sexton (2006, Michigan State/Bowling Green):

Might have proven the most dominant defensive lineman of the decade before his senior season ended with an injury after seven games and with 75 tackles.

## • Defensive lineman: Chris Patrick, Ithaca (2003, Nebraska):

Capped a solid career with 95 tackles and seven sacks as a senior, when he made the Class C all-state team. He's been in multiple NFL camps as an offensive lineman over the last few seasons.

## Defensive lineman: Joe Wohlscheid, Grand Ledge (2001, Grand Valley State/Northwestern):

Made the Class A all-state team as a senior with 76 tackles as a dominating force up front on the Division 1 state champion team.

### Linebacker: Brad Jones, East Lansing (2004, Colorado):

Arguably the area's best player of the decade overall, he was the Class A state Player of the Year runner-up playing linebacker with the speed of a running back. He started games for the Green Bay Packers as a rookie last season.

## • Linebacker: Mitch Zajac, Holt (2008, Western Michigan):

All-area for four seasons and three positions, Zajac made the Dream Team as a junior and senior linebacker, combining for 294 tackles over those two seasons. He also was the LSJ overall Male Athlete of the Year.

### Linebacker:

Justin Braska, DeWitt (2005, Western Michigan): Made 132 tackles as a senior in helping the Panthers to a Division 4 state runner-up finish and in getting named LSJ defensive Player of the Year.

### Defensive back: Demetrius Hallums, East Lansing (2001, Wayne State):

Made the LSJ all-area Dream Team as a senior as one of the area's fastest players and after helping the Trojans to the Division 3 state final.

## • Defensive back: Nate Turner, Haslett (2006, Western Michigan):

Lesser known on defense than as a star quarterback, Turner finished his career with seven interceptions and 10 pass break-ups in leading the Vikings to a Division 3 state runner-up finish.

# • Defensive back: Jacob Wyatt, Sexton (2005, Eastern Michigan):

Tallied an impressive 96 tackles and four interceptions as a senior, but also six sacks as a hammer from the safety spot. He was named the LSJ overall Male Athlete of the Year.

## Defensive back: Lavelle Walker, Everett (2009, Grand Valley State):

Made two straight all-area Dream Teams as a safety, with a combined 127 tackles and seven interceptions over those seasons for strong Everett defenses.

• Punter: Ryan Patten, Charlotte (2005, Olivet College): Averaged 46.5 yards per punt as a senior, the gold standard among Dream Team punters during the decade, and also earned an all-state honorable mention as a senior. Also the Dream Team punter as a junior averaging 41.8 yards per boot.

### Coach: Rob Zimmerman, DeWitt:

Coming off a combined 9-9 record over its previous two seasons, DeWitt went 102-21 during the decade with seven league championships and state runner-up finishes three straight seasons from

2002-04.
